	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to a study on the side effects, adverse reactions,
3	including death, and the effectiveness of vaccines against the
4	SARS-CoV-2 virus (COVID-19) or its variants.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. (a) In this section:
7	1) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services
8	Commission.
9	2) "Executive commissioner" means the executive commissioner
10	of the Health and Human Services Commission.
11	3) "Department" means the Department of State Health
12	Services.
13	4) "COVID-19" means the SARS-CoV-2 virus and any of its
14	variants.
15	5) "Vaccine" means a substance used to stimulate immunity to
16	a particular infectious disease or pathogen, typically prepared
17	from an inactivated or weakened form of the causative agent or from
18	its constituents or products.
19	(b) The Commission in collaboration with the Department shall
20	conduct a study to assess the full and complete adverse reactions,
21	including death, and effectiveness of each type of vaccine used in
22	Texas to defend the human body against "COVID-19. The Report must

23 include:

1) The immediate short-term side effects and adverse

reactions recipients experienced from taking the various COVID-19 1 2 vaccines used in Texas; including but not limited to include: i. Pain, swelling, or redness where the shot was given 3 ii. Mild fever 4 5 iii. Chills iv. Feeling tired 6 7 v. Headache Muscle and joint aches vi. 8 9 2) The immediate serious side effects and adverse reactions recipients experienced from taking the various COVID-19 vaccines 10 used in Texas; including but not limited to include: 11 12 i. difficulty breathing; ii. swelling of the face and throat; 13 iii. accelerated heartbeat; 14 15 iv. a body rash; 16 v. dizziness; and 17 vi. weakness 18 3) Any long-term side effects and adverse reactions recipients have experienced from taking the various COVID-19 19 vaccines used in Texas; including but not limited to include: 20 i. paralysis; 21 22 ii. Myocarditis; iii. clotting disorders; 23 Thrombosis with Thrombocytopenia Syndrome (TTS); 24 iv. 25 v. Guillain-Barré syndrome (GBS); vi. difficulty thinking or "brain fog," 26 27 vii. chronic pain;

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viii. tiredness and fatigue;

ix. loss of taste;

3 x. depression;

4 xi. anxiety; and

5 xii. death.

6 4) Any misrepresentations about the effectiveness or
7 dangers of taking of the vaccine by its manufacturers or any
8 governmental agency; and,

9 5) Any concealment of information about the 10 effectiveness or dangers of taking of the vaccine by its 11 manufacturers or any governmental agency.

12 (c) The Commission and the Department shall gather information for 13 the report from:

14 1) information collected by the Commission and the 15 Department, including information from the department's vital 16 statistics unit and the state Medicaid program;

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2) hospitals, treatment centers, available surveys; and

18 3) and other relevant sources.

SECTION 2. (a) Not later than January 1, 2024, the Commission and 19 20 Department shall prepare and submit to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the 21 22 Chairpersons of the relevant Texas legislative committees with jurisdiction over the Commission and the Department, a copy of the 23 24 report, summary of any findings, and any recommendations for 25 legislative or executive action to reduce the prevalence of 26 COVID-19 Vaccine side effects. The department may post the report

27 on the department's Internet website.

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(b) The Commission and Department may accept gifts, grants,
 and donations from any source to fund expenses
 incurred by the Commission and the Department in
 preparing the report.

5 SECTION 3. This Act expires September 1, 2025.

6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote 7 of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided 8 by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does 9 not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes 10 effect September 1, 2023.
